

News from Kiribati Class

What a fabulous start to the year we have had in Kiribati Class! One of the first things we learned was that our class name is pronounced 'Kiribas' and that this country is the first to see each new dawn. However, we have also started learning about the challenges faced by the people who live there and look forward to finding out more during the year.





We began the year with a very exciting Book World Cup. After exploring the covers, blurbs and extracts from thirty-two books, we held a series of rounds to select our class novel. There was some excellent discussion taking place and several children had hard choices to make when their favourite books had to go head-to-head in the heats.

We have now started to read the winner of our Book World Cup: 'The Dreamsnatcher' by Abi Elphinstone.

Each day, we spend at least 15 minutes reading independently in class. There are five children selected to be reading monitors each week who take it in turns to listen to other children read. We especially enjoy sitting in our new reading space: Starbooks. Please encourage your child to read each night at home too.





In English, we have started a unit based around the book 'Cloudbusting' by Malorie Blackman. Already we have produced some excellent writing and are developing our reading skills by focusing on the different types of questions we can ask to extend our reading of stories told in different ways.
