

# News from Easter Island Class

What an incredibly busy start we've had to the school year!

We spent the first few days getting to know each other and learning about our namesake – Easter Island. We completed some map work, drew pictures of the Moai and made our own using clay.







In science we have been developing our understanding of sound. We made string telephones – did you know that when the string is tight you can actually feel the vibrations of the sound travelling along?

We also tested different materials to help sound proof a box – we found that the padding from inside a coat was the best – that was because the many layers helped absorb the sound as it travelled through!

Finally, we got to make our own instruments using household junk! It was a bit messy and very noisy, but we had the best afternoon!

In maths we have been working hard on developing our understanding of Place Value and moving on to working with 4 and 5-digit numbers. We have worked through a wide range of problems that have challenged our practical and reasoning skills.

In English we have been reading the Tin Forest and have spent time working on our description and sentence structures as well as converting a text from 3<sup>rd</sup> person to 1<sup>st</sup> person. We have written some good diary entries too!

















Over the next 2 weeks we will be learning how to build and program a game in ICT; developing our understanding of teamwork and our own roles in the school community and classroom in PSHE and the concept of Obedience through the story of Noah in RE. We also have a Reading Room Adventure coming to school and a visit to St Paul's Church for the Bible Comes to Life Exhibition.
