

Learning Experiences in Tonga Class

So far this term we have been learning about...



In Maths we have been exploring addition and subtraction. We have been consolidating our knowledge of number pairs whilst discovering the relationship between addition and subtraction. We are amazed with the magic of maths and how 3 'special numbers' can give us 4 'magic sentences'!

In English we have been reading Walk with a Wolf by Janni Howler. The book has taught us loads of facts about wolves; when cubs are born, what wolves eat, where they live and how they hunt! We've used this information to create our own fact and information pages.





At the beginning of the term we studied Geography during Discovery lessons. We learnt all about urban and rural areas and how you can identify one from the other, by looking at their characteristics! We began by concentrating on Newport as an urban area and looked at the features of the town on an Ordnance Survey map. In order to make our comparisons we went for a

lovely trip to St Helens and The Duver to see the contrast of a rural area. Here, the children identified key features of a rural area and came to the conclusion that St Helens was in fact, a rural setting!

We used our trip to The Duver to begin to explore beach huts - ready for our next Discovery topic. We were honoured to have Trudi Bridgeman come and visit us and show us all of her tiny beach hut creations - they really inspired us! We have planned our beach hut designs... Now we just need to make them.









Finally, in ICT, we have just begun to explore the concept of algorithm instructions. We have become Treasure Hunters for this term and in order to find our treasure, we need to set instructions and be able to debug them!

For KS1 we have been learning the fundamental skills involved in invasion games, such as movement, passing, attacking and defending. KS2 have been looking at Tag Rugby in particular, as it is a perfect example of the key lessons in our topic of Invasion Games. The children have had lots of fun, progressing from simple tag tasks through to the more complex rules of Tag Rugby. Yr 5/6 can now use the skills learnt to hold tournaments in their P.E lessons, while several children who demonstrate our school values have been chosen to take part in Tag Rugby Festivals against other Island schools.
