## **News from Santorini Class**

Santorini Class have been working hard lately across all areas of the curriculum and we are going to share a few of these experiences with you today.

In English, we have just finished writing our own diaries based on 'The Christmas Truce,' that occurred in the trenches between the English and the Germans during WW1. The children enjoyed re-enacting this, and they used some great vocabulary to describe the trenches and the soldiers' feelings.



Our recent learning in Maths has been about multiplication and division. We have been learning how to make equal groups and how repeated addition (3 + 3 + 3 + 3) is the same as multiplication  $(4 \times 3)$ .



In Discovery, we enjoyed learning about Wassily Kandinsky. He was an artist from Russia who many people believe introduced the concept of abstract art. We had fun creating 3D art and painting our own pictures in his style.

We have also been busy learning about different animals and what they need in their habitats to survive. We went on a hunt around school looking for habitats and micro habitats. Then we created our own 3D habitats back in the classroom.
