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


Learning in New Zealand class




The first two weeks of this term, we immersed ourselves in poetry. We looked at different ways that poets are inspired and tried some of the techniques ourselves. We looked at onomatopoeia through the exploration of water, rise and fall through dance and finally rhythm by adding different sounds to the poem 'The Sound Collector.' We really enjoyed the opportunity to perform some poems from the book and used them as inspiration to write our own poems.

Currently in English we are reading 'The Dark' by Lemony Snicket. Bit by bit the story has been revealed and we are all on the edge of our seats waiting to find out what the dark is up to! Today we had a debate about whether or not Laszlo should listen to the dark. We listened carefully to each other's opinions and responded using phrases such as 'That was a good point but I don't agree because...' The children learnt that a well thought out argument has the power to change people's minds.











We love books! Our favourite part of the day is sharing our class read. This is just a selection of the books we have read over the year. The adventures and different worlds we have been to have stimulated our imaginations and helped us to develop our vocabulary.
