Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know our long awaited OFSTED inspection took place last Wednesday and Thursday. Many thanks to all parents who took the time to complete the questionnaire on Parent view or indeed stopped to speak with one of the inspectors at the school gate. The parental feedback was very positive and we thank you for your support both during the inspection and beyond. The actual inspection is only the start of the process as the draft report has to be written and quality assured before we are able to confirm the final judgements. We have been told that the final report should be completed, and so ready to share with all children, parents and staff, soon after the half term break. Please be assured that we will send it out to all as soon as it arrives.

I would like to say a particular 'Well done' to our year 6 children for their mature approach to the recent end of key stage 2 tests. I am absolutely sure that each and every one of the children gave their best. It is worth remembering that these tests are measuring such a small part of what makes each child unique and shine - as they don't measure how caring or thoughtful each child is, how skilled they are in sport, their creative talents or just how much they have grown in self- confidence. Whatever the outcome for each individual, we are extremely proud of them all.

As part of Christian Aid week, UKS2 have been exploring and discussing what it means to be a migrant or a refugee. The work that has been produced by all of the pupils has been exemplary and I would like to share with you a poem written by one of our pupils in Year 5, Joseph Wells. The poem very skilfully highlights both sides of current debates around this issue and needs to be read as it is and then in reverse.




