Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very much looking forward to both our moving up day and Open Evening which are taking place next week; these provide the opportunity for both the children and parents to meet the class teachers they will be working with next year.

Sadly we are saying goodbye to a few members of the staff team at the end of this year. I would like to thank Ms Jackson for her work in Y1, Mr Padley for his work in Y3 and Mr Lawrence for his work in Y4, these teachers have been temporarily covering posts due to either maternity leaves or changes in staffing arrangements. Mrs Barrie will also be leaving Newport as she is off on adventures with her family to Spain. We wish all those leaving every success and happiness in their new ventures and I am sure parents would like to join me in thanking them for their significant contribution to the on-going success of Newport.

We have been very fortunate to have recruited some very talented and experienced staff to join the teaching team at Newport in September. Mrs Nina Lawrence is joining us as a class teacher and leader of KS2; Mrs Lisenka Exell is joining us as a class teacher and subject leader and Miss Ella McDonald is joining the KS1 team as a class teacher. All our new staff will be at Newport next Thursday for the moving up day and Open Evening.

The class teacher arrangements will all be announced next Thursday. The very successful model, as noted by both parents and in our recent Ofsted inspection, of key stage phases will be fully in place from September. This links to the recent decision to adapt our 'pupil admission number' to 45 per year group with classes organised as follows:

EYFS - 2 classes operating as an early years base Key Stage one - 3 classes (Y1, Y1/2, Y2) Lower Key Stage 2 - 3 classes (Y3, Y3/4, Y4) Upper Key Stage 2 - 3 classes (Y5, Y5/6, Y6)

The classes will be organised using the children's months of birth - with very few adaptations which are only due to exceptional reasons.

I very much look forward to welcoming you all to the Open Evening next Thursday, when you will have the opportunity to see the excellent work your child has produced this year and also meet your child's class teacher for September.

Volunteering is an excellent thing for your personal development as looks great on a CV.


Home-Start IOW offers full training so no experience necessary other than the parenting or caring experience you already have.


