Dear Parents and Carers,

Our enrichment programme has been full steam ahead as each phase has been extending their learning through our planned programme of educational visits: as part of a project on 'Forces' our Y5&6 children visited Paultons Park, which involved evaluating the forces at work in a range of rides. Y3/4 have visited The Long Stone at Mottistone as part of 'The Stone Age to Iron Age' project; and Y1/2 have also been out and about visiting The Quay Arts, building an understanding of what an Art Gallery involves - something they will be creating later this year. The learning from these trips will be explored further within the classroom through written and other creative work.

Science Days have also been taking place across the school, as Mrs Chatfield has set up a most engaging range of practical science experiments for the children to investigate. The children have been finding out about 'rocks & soils', 'properties of different materials' and 'forces'.

As we move towards Harvest, our EYFS, Y1 & 2 children are busy preparing to lead our Harvest Worship. This year all harvest donations are being given to the IOW FOODBANK - so please give generously. All donations need to be in school from Monday 2nd Oct. Parents of children involved in leading the worship are invited to join the worship on Friday 6th Oct, which starts at 9.15am.

As part of our on-going work to teach children how to stay safe online, our Y4,5&6 children attended a show - In The Net - which gave the serious messages in a fun but informative way. We all know that children today are faced with real online risks, and so we encourage parents to keep a watchful eye on their child's online activity.

Improving the music provision at Newport is a focus for us this year, this includes encouraging children to learn a musical instrument. This week a cellist performed to KS2, hopefully inspiring some of children to take up the challenging, but rewarding, task of learning to play the cello.

Please keep a look out for letters in the children's bags for the range of opportunities taking place in our school.
