Dear Parents and Carers,

Earlier this week we held some maths information meetings for parents and those who were able to attend found them very useful. As parents have asked for more information about maths an information sheet for each year group is being sent home this week which outlines the essential knowledge and skills a child should have by the end of their current academic year. Please read it through and support your child in learning the key facts.

As part of our aim for every child to develop a healthy lifestyle the children participate in indoor and outdoor PE lessons every week. Many thanks to all those parents who make sure that their child has a suitable PE kit in school each week. If this isn't the case, please make sure that your child is not missing out by making sure that they have a kit, which is named and includes everything needed. When the weather is cold we encourage the children to have some kind of track suit bottoms - of any colour. For hygiene reasons we do not allow the children to wear tights, which they then keep on all day.

A huge well done to the vast number of children across the school who achieved 100% attendance last term, certificates have been awarded to all of these children today to bring home. As you know the details around 'leave of absence' from school, other than illness, is a national issue. As a school we are not able to authorise holidays during term time, and indeed only able to authorise a leave of absence for 'exceptional' circumstances. Should you wish to make a request we now require parents to complete a specific form which can be obtained at the school office or on the school website. Your support in this matter is very appreciated.

Over the last two terms we have been deepening our work as a 'Church school', part of which has been to review our core church values. As a school community we believe these to be: PEACE, COMPASSION, ENDURANCE & FELLOWSHIP. Our worship themes have focused on these values, helping to support the development of the children's understanding of what they mean in a christian context and how these values guide us in our daily life. We have also reviewed and renewed our approach to the teaching of RE, with the aim of developing a real sense of enquiry and interest in finding out about the beliefs behind Christianity and other major religions.

We look forward to sharing more of the children's work and thinking in this area over the coming terms.

Learning Experiences in Mitchell Class

We've made a great start to 2018 and have been busy learning about measures in maths.

We worked on comparing different units of measure by drawing lines of different lengths and weighing objects around the classroom.



We are working towards adding and subtracting units of measure as well as working with money later next week!

We've been getting crafty by drawing around our hands on felt and cutting them out. These will be used to create a banner for one of our school's Christian Values. LKS2 are making a banner for Fellowship.



Other banners in the school will be for Peace, Compassion and Endurance.

We also started Big Maths this week—this is a scheme which has been designed to help us with our mental arithmetic. We are getting our heads around how it all works and have already had a go at Learn Its and Big **Beat That Challenges!**



In Religious Education we've been enjoying learning about the Hindu festival of Holi and how Good and Evil is portrayed. We listened to the story of Prahlad and then reenacted it in groups.



We discussed how different the characters were and linked the idea of good and evil to our own lives.

We now understand that sometimes good things can come from bad situations and that it is important to remain positive at all times.



Since the start of term we have been immersed in the work of Anthony Browne and we are currently studying his book, Into the Forest.

We have made predictions about what the story could be about and have linked it to other stories we have read in the past.



The children wrote some questions to ask the main characters and then had to act in role to answer these. This allowed them to empathise with the characters and they wrote a letter from one character to another.



At the end of the unit, we will plan and write our own alternative fairy-tales.



Polite reminder - school meals are now £1.85 each and must be paid for either in advance, or on the day taken.


