# Learning Experiences in Seuss

So far in 2018 we have been learning about...



In Maths we have been exploring fractions. We have learnt how to find half and quarters of shapes and numbers. Some children even discovered that half of a half is a quarter!

In English we have been reading The Emperor's Egg. The book has taught us loads of facts about Emperor penguins; how they are born, who looks after the baby penguins, what they eat and how they stay warm! We've used this information to create our own fact and information pages ready to make our own Emperor Penguin fact book.





We have just finished the Discovery topic of Going for Goals. We looked at different careers and even thought about what we all wanted to be when we are older and what skills we need in order to be successful. The children decided, during a discussion, that you can be either gender to do any job!

In PE, Seuss Class have been focusing on gymnastics; in particular shapes you can make with your body and balancing. We've got the equipment out and the children loved exploring different shapes they could make when jumping. What great teamwork as well!







Finally, in ICT, we have begun to create our very own eBook of The Gingerbread Man. In pairs the children are working together to create a page for the book. So far we've completed our page plans and thought about the size of objects and their colours.
